

The American Psychoanalytic Association (APsaA) has established a special category of affiliation for psychodynamic researchers called the Research Associates of the American Psychoanalytic Association (RAAPA).

RAAPA is available to anyone who has an interest in psychoanalytically oriented research, including research scientists and research-oriented clinicians.

RAAPA promotes a unique exchange among its associates to foster collaboration and the communication of research developments and results.

RAAPA works in conjunction with the Psychodynamic Psychoanalytic Research Society to develop the Research Symposium at APsaA's biannual meetings and facilitates presentations of research at these psychoanalytic meetings, enhancing the visibility of psychoanalytic research.

The **Fund for Psychoanalytic Research** supports basic and applied research involving psychoanalytic perspectives and observations; and research related to clinical and developmental process and outcome as well as other perspectives. For more information, visit apsa.org.

APsaA's National Meeting each January features a **Poster Session** that invites submissions with conceptual and/or empirical relevance to psychoanalytic theory, technique, aspects of practice, and effectiveness of psychoanalysis. Of special interest is interdisciplinary scholarship addressing research questions in 'neighboring fields' — including clinical, developmental and social psychology, family psychology, neuroscience, anthropology, sociology, literary criticism, as well as historical studies, history of ideas and art history.
